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### Introduction

This postcard report outlines the achievements of our 2024 sailing voyage to support young people born without eyes or with under-developed eyes.

This voyage was a unique opportunity for participants to develop new skills, grow in confidence, and strengthen their social and teamwork abilities, all while exploring the beautiful southwest coast of England.

# Purpose of the programme

The primary objective of this voyage was to provide an inclusive, supportive, and challenging environment for young people with MACS conditions to experience sailing. The voyage served as a platform for personal growth, leadership development, and the promotion of independence. Key goals:

- Build confidence
- Enhance teamwork, problem-solving, and communication skills
- Promote independence, resilience and the ability to cope with new experiences
- Foster a sense of community among voyagers facing similar challenges.

# **Voyage Overview**

The voyage took place along the southwest coast, starting in Brixham and traveling to key coastal locations, including Dartmouth, Cawsand Bay, Fowey, and Plymouth. Highlights included meeting the crew of another sail training vessel, Johanna Lucretia, and helping tow a disabled vessel back to Brixham harbor. Throughout the voyage, the weather was outstanding, allowing participants to fully engage in the experience and enjoy the beauty of the southwest coast.

Total distance sailed: 136 miles

Number of participants: 10

Duration: 6 nights, 7 days



## **Outcomes & Impact**

This year's sailing trip was successful in fostering personal growth across various areas. Using the Outcomes Wheel, developed in collaboration with Children in Need and the Prince's Trust, participants rated their progress in key areas from the start to the end of the voyage. There were measurable improvements in confidence, teamwork, and the ability to cope with new experiences.

From the nine sailors who agreed to take part in the evaluation this year, we saw a marked change from the start to the end results, with overall scores for all the young people moving up 70.5 points from the start to the end of the voyage. These were evaluated in the following categories:

- Feeling confident (+8 points overall)
- Working in a team (+8 points overall)
- Learning new skills (+12 points overall)
- Coping with new experiences (+8.5 points overall)
- Getting on with people (+7 points overall)
- Dealing with setbacks (+8 points overall)
- Compromise & negotiation (+6 points overall)
- Learning from experience (+5 points overall)
- Looking after myself (+3 points overall)
- Communication (+5 points overall)

This sailing voyage had a profound effect on the participants, fostering not only technical sailing skills but also personal growth in areas such as leadership, communication, and social interaction. Participants formed strong bonds with one another, building a sense of community and mutual support. Their confidence in handling challenges increased as they took on various responsibilities aboard the ship.







## **Individual success stories**

**AD (age 22):** Took the lead on sail drops and developed her technical sailing skills. She expressed interest in returning as a volunteer in the future, reflecting her confidence and enthusiasm for sailing.

**AS (age 23):** Overcame her fear of getting into the dinghy which she has avoided during previous voyages, showing growth in confidence and resilience.

**WA (age 19):** Demonstrated significant personal growth, transitioning from limited speech to full conversations by the end of the week.

**HD (age 19):** Showed growth in her sailing abilities and displayed a proactive approach to the wellbeing and morale of the group and became a source of comfort for her peers

#### Challenges, learning and recommendations

While the voyage was a success, feedback from both staff and participants highlighted a couple of challenges:

- 1. Some experienced crew members felt pressure to assist less able participants, which detracted from their ability to enjoy the experience. A suggestion was made to involve dedicated carers or buddies for those who need more support.
- 2. One participant, (W aged 19) thrived with the support of his peers but would benefit from having a designated helper for future trips.

#### Conclusion

The 2024 sailing voyage with MACS was a remarkable success, offering a unique and transformative experience for all participants. The combination of sailing challenges, teamwork, and personal development helped our young MACS members grow in confidence, resilience, and camaraderie.

Members were pushed beyond their comfort zones, gaining practical skills in sailing while also developing key life skills such as leadership, communication, and problem-solving, that will help them as they transition into an independent adulthood.

Feedback from the voyage suggests that this project continues to be a vital opportunity for young people with MACS to thrive in a supportive and challenging environment. As we look to the future, we aim to build on these successes, refining our support structures to ensure that every participant, regardless of their needs, can fully enjoy and benefit from the experience.

We are incredibly proud of what the crew achieved this year, and we look forward to continuing this valuable work with future voyages.

Plans for 2025 are already underway. We've booked the Prolific again for **05 - 10 August 2025**, with space for 12 MACS members. We'd be delighted to have you *on board* again, should you want to continue funding this worthwhile initiative.
